An Invaluable Gift

Over the many years of my life I have been fortunate enough to have received many gifts. Some were birthday gifts, some were Christmas gifts, some were thank you gifts. A very good friend of mine gave to me a baseball signed by Johnny Bench that I treasure. I have shirts and jerseys in my closet given to me by my wife. And I have a plethora of gift cards still unused. The watch that I wear everyday was a gift from my wife that I treasure because it is from her. The only time I don't wear that watch is when I golf. Recently the watch was off by several hours, and I thought, "Oh no, my watch has died." Thankfully, it is a self-winding watch and just needed me to wear the watch and move around. 



We should not take lightly a beloved dog's worth. To prove their love they'll move heaven and earth. A joyful companion~ they will even play catch.


Just toss a ball and loudly yell "fetch!"


